### **VACAVILLE ASSISTS FAIRFIELD WITH PURSUIT OF YOUNG DRIVER**

A 15-year-old Suisun City resident led three different police agencies on a pursuit on Monday night that ended with the young driver surrendering to authorities.

Vacaville police were notified at about 8: 43 p.m. Monday that the Fairfield Police Department had terminated the pursuit of a stolen vehicle that was last seen entering Vacaville city limits on northbound Peabody Road. A California Highway Patrol helicopter was overhead monitoring the pursuit and updating the suspect vehicle's location to ground officers. Vacaville officers became involved in the pursuit at the intersection of Nut Tree Road and Alamo Drive. The suspect was driving at speeds of 40-50 miles per hour and in a reckless manner with disregard for public safety.

The suspect lead officers on a 2.4 mile pursuit on surface streets. The pursuit was terminated when the suspect voluntarily stopped in the area of Alamo and Bel-Air drives. A 15-year-old male Suisun City resident was arrested and turned over the Fairfield Police Department who responded to the scene and took custody of the suspect and took over the investigation. The vehicle was released at the scene to the registered owner, and no one was injured during this incident.
