TWO ARRESTED AT PREMIUM OUTLETS ON VARIETY OF CHARGES

An argument with an employee at a local retail store led to the arrest of two Sacramento women on a variety of charges, including probation violation, child endangerment and burglary.

On December 16, 2012 at 4:46 p.m., officers responded to a disturbance call at one of the stores located in the Vacaville Premium Outlets. The officers, who were assigned to a special Retail Detail during the holidays at the Outlets, contacted two females involved in a disturbance with a store employee. The two females had been in the store a few days earlier and had caused a disturbance with store employees. The same women returned to the business December 16th and began arguing with a store employee. The women had two small children with them.

Officers detected a strong odor of marijuana on them. As they were attempting to drive away with the children, officers conducted a probation compliance check and searched their vehicle, where property stolen from several different outlet stores was located. Employees from those stores were contacted and subsequently identified the property as being stolen. Officers also learned both females were on active probation out of Sacramento County and one of them had a suspended driver's license.

Police arrested S-Marjorie Suntok Madison, 37, of Sacramento and S-Tyease Ayesha James, 38, also of Sacramento. They were booked into Solano County Jail for commercial burglary, possession of stolen property, violation of probation, possession of a controlled substance, and child endangerment. The two small children were taken into protective custody and released to Solano County Child Protective Services.
