On May 17, 2013 the Vacaville Police Department's Youth Services Section (YSS) conducted a Minor Decoy Operation. The operation used minor decoys to attempt to purchase alcohol at local businesses licensed through the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

The minor decoys worked under the direct supervision of police officers and attempted to purchase alcoholic beverages from businesses that are licensed to sell to adults over the age of 21. Purchase attempts were made at 54 local businesses and only one clerk sold beer to the decoy. The clerk was arrested for violation of section 25658(a) B&P – Selling alcoholic beverages to a minor, and released on a signed promise to appear.

The clerks who did not sell to the minor decoys are to be commended for their efforts to insure the youth of the community do not have access to alcoholic beverages through their businesses.

The funds for this operation and the Alcohol, Tobacco and other Drugs (ATOD) efforts of the Vacaville Police Department's Youth Services Section is made possible through grants from the Solano County Board of Supervisors and the Reducing Rates Coalition.

The goals of this operation was to: (1) Reduce underage consumption of, and access to, alcohol by deterring adults from selling to youth from licensed premises; (2) Expand the involvement of local law enforcement in enforcing underage drinking laws; and (3) Raise public awareness about the problem.
