ONE SUSPECT IN CUSTODY ONE SUSPECT OUTSTANDING IN EARLY MORNING BURGLARY

On Thursday, November 27, 2014, at 6:18 a.m., Vacaville Police Department Dispatch received a 9-1-1 call in reference to a reported residential burglary in progress. The victim reported he had just arrived home from work and heard people inside his house. The suspects fled out the back door of the house and over the back fence. Patrol officers responded to the area and began searching for the suspects. Officers located a vehicle leaving the area and attempted a traffic stop for a minor traffic violation. The vehicle pulled over in the 1900 block of Marshall Road. The front passenger of the suspect vehicle immediately ran from the car and jumped a fence into the rear yard of a residence. It appears the suspect continued jumping fences into yards while running north. The driver of the vehicle, S-William Anderson, was detained at the car. Evidence in the vehicle, as well as along the flight path of the second suspect, was linked back to the victim residence.

A perimeter was established and a yard to yard search was conducted, utilizing two Vacaville Police Department K-9's, and the CHP fixed wing aircraft. The outstanding suspect was not located. He is described as a black male with dreadlocks, wearing dark clothing.

S-Anderson was arrested and booked into Solano County Jail on the charges of residential burglary, possession of stolen property, conspiracy, and driving on a suspended license. S-Anderson was also found to be on active probation so he was placed on a probation hold. A photo of S-Anderson is attached.
