Five arrested for DUI in Vacaville Sunday night / early Monday morning

Vacaville, CA – Five people were arrested in Vacaville for driving under the influence during a DUI saturation effort on Sunday night.

The Solano County AVOID the 10 DUI Task Force deployed three DUI officers from the Vacaville Police Department Sunday between 6 p.m. and midnight. The enforcement effort was part of the Winter Mobilization period, which runs from December 12 – January 1, 2015.

While the Vacaville PD AVOID the 10 Task Force Officers were out they made two DUI arrests:

- Tia Simon, 32, of Vacaville was arrested Sunday night for DUI after being involved in a non-injury traffic collision.
- Theodis King, 29, of Vacaville was arrested Sunday night for DUI following a traffic stop.

After the AVOID the 10 DUI Task Force Officers concluded their enforcement operations the DUI arrests continued. Patrol officers from Vacaville PD arrested the following:

- Angela Rodriguez, 37, of Vacaville was arrested early Monday morning for DUI following a traffic stop.
- Thomas Hope, 50, of Vacaville was arrested early Monday morning following a traffic stop.
- Wyatt Boykin, 21, of Vacaville was arrested for DUI after the vehicle he was driving backed into a home in the 1200 block of Marshall Road.

These (5) DUI arrests were certainly avoidable. The AVOID the 10 DUI Task Force would like to remind motorists they can avoid being arrested for DUI by following these tips:

- Always designate a sober driver.
- If you are drunk, take a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation.

Also remember:

- If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact local law enforcement.
- If you know someone who is about to drive or ride impaired, take their keys and help them make safe travel arrangements to where they are going.
